CONSERVATION:

William Crawford Rackham was born in Stratford on Avon, England on 18 August 1869. It is unknown when he came to Canada, but he entered service with the Hudson's Bay Company in 1902 as general help at the Lesser Slave Lake post.

In 1903, Rackham was transferred to Fort Vermillion, where he worked as a clerk for nine years. He then became an Inspecting Clerk for the Athabasca District until 1915 at which time he rose to the position of Inspecting Officer of the Keewatin District. In 1918 he became a District Manager stationed in the James Bay District where he remained until his resignation on 31 May 1921.

The collection was presented to the Archives by Carl S. Simonson of Winnipeg in 1965 (1965-57). It consists of three albums and one folder which, together, contain a total of 222 photographs. The photographs include scenes from both the Athabasca and Keewatin Districts (i.e. northern Alberta and Manitoba). They were presumably taken when Rackham was Inspecting Clerk in Athabasca (1912-15) and Inspecting Officer in Keewatin (1915-18).

Although the photos in the albums are in their original order, it is likely that Book 3 (#146-#214) contains the earliest photos as they show almost exclusively Athabascan territory. Books 1 and 2 appear to follow in roughly chronological order.

The photos are numbered and many have previously been identified, presumably by Rackham. There are about 45 duplicates within the collections as indicated in the item list.
